

DRAFT MINUTES OF GREAT GLEMHAM ANNUAL MEETING OF THE PARISH

held at 6.30 pm on Monday 20th May 2019 In The Village Hall

Present: Cllr Beaumont, Cllr Benson, Cllr Cross, Cllr Debenham, Cllr Gathorne-Hardy (Chair), Cllr French, and Cllr Lissaman, Suffolk County Councillor Burroughes and 11 Members of the public.

1. The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting.
2. Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr Runnacles.
3. The minutes of the Annual Meeting of the Parish 2018 were consolidated minutes with those of the 2018 AGM and have therefore been previously approved and signed.
4. Reports were received and distributed from the following, and attached as appendixes where available:

Suffolk County Councillor Burroughes highlighted a few points from his report as follows:

- Special Education Needs Department (SEND) – more specialist places being created in Suffolk to meet the needs of local children instead of sending them out of the county
- Lowestoft 3rd crossing will take place which will be beneficial to the A12 route north
- Sizewell 4 village bypass it still being negotiated with EDF. The Stage 3 consultation probably left more questions than answers
- Highways investing in a Thermal Patcher to tackle potholes

Question for the SCC Councillor: Special Needs seems to have gone full circle?

Answer: 1 new specialist school is being built. The aim is to build specialist units alongside mainstream schools
